


# **Guide to Waters**

River Ure




## Guide to fishing Worton Beat – R.Ure



W1	This is the top of the beat. There are two ways to enter this area. The first is by crossing over the Stepping Stones and then moving inside the trees along the bank. The other is to push through the trees onto the water. It is reasonably easy wading inside the tree line but the water is shallow. The best fishing water lies along the opposite bank which is not BCAA water.
W2	This is below the Stepping Stone and provides access to the faster waters just below the stones. You will need to push through the trees and wade along the inside of them. This is not shallow water but it is stable under foot. You will need to be aware of overhead branches when casting in this area to avoid hook ups. There are some large fish resident in this water.
W3	You can access this water down the steep bank onto rocky section. Be careful when descending. It pays to move very cautiously once you reach the river side as there are many fish in the more shallower waters. You will notice faster water downstream and this is where you should start. You will often find trout in the faster water in the pockets. Above this and all the way up to the Stepping Stones the water is only wade with care. This is a long pool which can hold a good head of Grayling and some are quite large.
W4	This area is downstream of the very fast thin water. It is easily accessible and there is a good pool against the BCAA bank immediately below the fast water. While the water in this area holds fish, the faster flow is on the far bank which is not BCAA water. There is generally a good head of Grayling along this section with the odd good size trout.
W5	This is downstream of the above pool and below the fast water which drops the river down a few feet. It is easily accessible from the top or down near the bridge. The better water is on the BCAA side of the river and can flow quite quickly. This area needs to be worked over with care and from the centre of the river. It holds both Grayling and trout, the latter can often surprise you in size.
W6	Immediately below the bridge, a fast run against the bank for 50 metres. Reasonable to access from the bank and can hold some nice fish. If you enter the river, keep in mind that we do not own the opposite bank.
W7	Our bank is heavily treed. However you can enter below the trees and work up our bank from the middle of the river. Wade with care because a you approach the top of the pool (below W6) the water gets deeper. This pool holds some nice trout and grayling.
W8	This section is long, relatively featureless and shallow. But it often holds some nice trout in the margins and seems a good spot for Grayling, especially opposite the three tree stumps on the opposite bank.
W9	This is a very deep pool caused by the entry of the beck opposite and the deep water extends to the weir, the end of the beat. Not wadeable but can hold some nice fish if you can reach them.

#### Waters Map - Aysgarth 1






## Guide to fishing Aysgarth 1 Beat – R.Ure





AG1 -1	This is at the top of the beat (approximately ½ mile below the Worton beat). At this point the water is deep and possibly not wadeable.
AG1 - 2	This is a long stretch (nearing 200 yards) of good fishable fast water. The deeper water is against the left bank. There are a few deeper sections but the water still flows at pace.
AG1 - 3	This pool is deep and drops off fast at the end of AG1 – 2. Be careful wading. It is good spot for trotting around the bend.
AG1 - 4	There is no access from the right hand side. Either go up or down to cross over to the left bank. This is reasonable fast flowing shallow water down to just below the stepping stones. Best fished from the left bank.
AG1 - 5	Deep pool and probably a good spot to trot down below the stepping stones. This pool extends downstream for about 100 yards.
AG1 - 6	The bank vegetation here is too thick to walk through. To access the top of Aysgarth 2 requires walking along the road which is extremely busy – take care. Access is available at the end of the thicket.
AG1 - 7	This area holds faster water downstream around the bend. However there is a deeper pool on the right bank on the river bend. Wade with care.
AG1 - 8	This section is deeper water and not wadeable. The deeper water extends for some 200 yards downstream
AG1 - 9	Tis is shallower water from the fence line below the deep water right down to Starra beck. The faster section is around the bend which also has a deep pool just above the bend. Wade with care.
AG1 - 10	This a deep pool which extends down onto Aysgarth 2 beat.
AG1 -1	This corner has a high bank on one side and fishable water below it. Always worth a look.

#### Waters Map – Aysgarth 2










## Guide to fishing Aysgarth 2 Beat – R.Ure



AG2 - 1	This is a deep section that extends downstream for approximately 150 yards.
AG2 - 2	This section is faster and shallower water that commences about 100 yards upstream of the stepping stones which are not marked on the map. it then extends downstream for a further 75 yards below the stepping stones.
AG2 - 3	Deeper water but with flow. Should suit trotting.
AG2 - 4	Faster water against right bank. Wade with care.
AG2 - 5	Deeper slow water. Not wadeable.
AG2 - 6	Wadeable faster water. Take care for deeper holes on right bank.
AG2 – 7	Good trotting water, access is better from left bank.
AG2 – 8	This bend is very deep and extends downstream from some 300 yards. Only suitable to worm fishing.
AG2 - 9	Shallow water with gravel bottom that extends in to the top beat of Aysgarth 3 beat



## Guide to fishing Aysgarth 3 Beat – R.Ure



AG3 - 1	This section is fast and shallow. It drops into deeper water on the bend.
AG3 – 2	Very deep and slow flowing water. Only suited to worm fishing.
AG3 - 3	Shallow water downstream for approximately 200 yards with best fishing against the left bank.
AG3 - 4	Deeper slow flowing section that could attract trotting.
AG3 - 5	Shallow fast water down into Eller Beck entry point. However, there is a deep pool where the beck flows into the river creating a good trotting opportunity. Take care when wading downstream. Access is difficult from the right bank so to enter this water enter from the left bank or move upstream of the beck.
AG3 - 6	The bottom of all BCAA water on the Ure. This is a very shallow fast flowing section and can hold a good head of fish. Access to this is similar to that of AG3 -5. Take care when wading and the BCAA water ends at the footbridge.
